Driver Education Class starts, **online** April 23, 2018 and ends June 1, 2018. If we have at least 12 students signed up for the class, then I will request a custom session to start at an earlier date. A custom session means you will make it into the class as long as you complete all the requirements listed below. Without a custom session of Driver Education, it is more difficult to gain a spot in the class, as it is offered to all students in the State of Idaho and several are vying for one of the 36 open spots they have.

Mike Tetwiler and Jake Maetche will be the BTW (behind the wheel) teachers. Class is limited to 24 students. The first 12 who sign up will start driving in April, while the other 12 will start driving in May- later part of May. Please make sure you have computer access as all the classwork is done online.

Go to the Driver's License Department, to purchase your permit, but wait until you are 14 ½ years old. Once you obtain your permit, please bring a copy of the receipt that has your DL number on it (ASAP), along with your school email address, contact phone number, parents email address to Mrs. Beck so that she can complete the enrollment process. Without the permit number and the above information, your enrollment will not be complete. See below.

The above needs to happen prior to enrolling in the class. When you are enrolled in the online course, you will receive emails from IDLA about the entire process such as website and log in information. The student will complete an online (3 hour) orientation class prior to the start date of the course. If the orientation is not completed, then a drop request will take place.

## Eligibility for the class:

- 1. Be at least 14 1/2 years of age by the permit date deadline-April 10, 2018 2018 (do not get permit until you are 14 ½ years of age- if you go before then, you will not be issued one).
- 2. Enrolled in School
- 3. Pay district fee of \$150 to OHS, plus \$75 for the online class. Total \$225.
- 4. Obtain learners permit at the Drivers License Department. When obtaining your learners permit you need to bring the following:
  - a. Picture ID
  - b. Social Security Card
  - c. State Certified Birth Certificate
  - d. Enrollment Compliance (from OJSHS)
  - e. Receipt (from OJSHS)
  - f. \$21.50
- g. Parent or legal guardian needs to be present (court documents verifying guardianship).
  - h. Return copy of your DL# to Mrs. Beck and the information below.
